


Important Coastal Streams and Proposed Tanker Routes



Over 50% of the salmon caught in BC travel through or reside in the area that Enbridge proposes to bring tankers through. A tanker accident on the north and central coast could affect some of the BC's most significant populations of salmon. We ranked BC's streams by size and the number of anadromous fish (species like salmon that use both marine and fresh water) that they are likely to support. About one in ten BC streams have the potential to host significant populations of these fish, with the Fraser, Nass and Skeena Rivers ranking highest (i.e. biggest and home to most species). Note: Eulachon were not considered in this analysis.
